Most organizations implement both reactive and proactive strategies for workplace injury prevention. Proactive tools anticipate a desired outcome for the future. Reactive strategies are based on mitigating incidents based on past events. Both approaches are necessary and provide value. However, the two approaches leave an effectiveness gap in terms of addressing what is currently happening in the present in terms of discomfort, pain, and injury. Early Intervention closes the gap by providing solutions for discomfort and seeking out injury causing situations as they occur in real time.
